Dear Church Family,

At the end of March we celebrated Jesus' Resurrection with an uplifting and joyful Easter Celebration, made extra special by the fact that we also baptised two ladies from our congregation. It might be tempting for some to say, "Well that's Easter done and dusted for this year", but of course Jesus' Resurrection has significance and meaning for us every day of our lives. Christians are "Easter People". The Resurrection is a key tenet of the Christian faith, and so really we celebrate it all year round! For the first disciples all those years ago, the Resurrection changed everything, and for us today as we start to, not just believe that it did happen, but to understand the importance of why it happened, then it gives our whole lives perspective and purpose. As I said on Easter Sunday the Resurrection enabled the first disciples to know the Presence of Christ with them again; the Peace of Christ – where they had been grieving, despairing and confused; the Hope of Christ – as they realised Good Friday was not the end of the story for Jesus or for them; and the Purpose of Christ, as Jesus gave them the task of passing on the Good News and taking the Gospel first to the immediate area, but then to the ends of the earth.

For us too, our lives are impacted by the Resurrection in similar ways. Because Jesus rose, we too can know the Presence of Christ by His Spirit wherever we go; We can know His peace that passes understanding when times are tough for us; we have a Hope and confident assurance, firstly that Jesus saved us, and that He has plans for our lives now, and that death is not the end for us - that we too will have a future existence with Him in eternity; and finally we understand that He has a Purpose for us too – that in His Great Commission He calls us all to share our faith and witness to the Gospel of salvation whenever we have the opportunity. As Easter People, we know Jesus didn't die in vain, and that His story has continued through the lives of generations of His disciples from that first Easter to today and beyond, until He returns again! So let's continue to celebrate His gift of life and love and Hope all through 2024!
